Local Republican Leader Appointed to Board of National Federation of Republican Women

ALEXANDRIA, Va. – A local Republican woman leader will serve on the Board of Directors of the National Federation of Republican Women (NFRW) during the 2010-2011 term.

NFRW President Sue Lynch has appointed **Bettye Chambers** of **Buford, GA** as Chairman of the **NFRW Website Assistance Committee**, which is responsible for helping Republican Women Clubs and Federations in establishing a web presence.

“With the 2010 elections just months away, the NFRW is gearing up to help Republicans across the country win races at the local, state and national levels,” Lynch said. “We are pleased that Bettye is going to play a key role in this effort by sharing her talents and ideas with our members across the nation.”

Bettye says “Websites and E-Newsletters are essential in spreading our conservative message and electing conservative Republicans across the nation in the 21st century. This form of communication is extremely important in 2010 and 2012 when women make up 52% of the voters in the nation.”
